SERMON OF THE MONTH

NAME: Tarun Zachariah TOPIC: St Matthew 23:34-39

SERMON SUMMARY

The last youth sermon provided some invaluable insight from the life of Jesus Christ to take with us into the New Year. Being the first Sunday since Epiphany, the focus was on 2 passages from the Gospel according to St. Matthew. The first passage provided an overview of Jesus recruiting his disciples and examples of his active Ministry. Then in stark contrast, we see a more despondent and grim quality in Jesus' character as the people of Israel are reminded of their betrayal and rejection of Him, and we are reminded that this is His last appearance before His crucifixion.

It offers the reader an opportunity to be enthralled by the iron resilience of Our Lord even in the most hopeless of circumstances. Even while bearing the brunt of this behaviour from the people of Israel, Jesus holds out and provides us the answer to salvation we desperately seek, which is to accept Him as our saviour.
